Supervisor James Schmitt opened the regular meeting of the town board of the Town of Pawling at 6:00 PM January 10, 2024 at Pawling Town Hall, 160 Charles Colman Blvd., Pawling, New York. Present were councilwomen Snow and Pitt, councilmen Mygan and McCarthy, Nancy Tagliafierro, town attorney and approximately 20 interested citizens.

PUBLIC COMMENT ON AGENDA ITEMS

Mr. Kenneth M. Stenger, attorney from the firm of Stenger, Diamond & Glass, LLP represented Mr. & Mrs. Elghanayan, who own a house next to the Dewey Lane Bridge, which is the subject of repair. He has had good communication and cooperation with the town and he thanked the town for that. He is here tonight because his clients asked him to place on the record the urgency they feel about the situation. He appreciated the opportunity to speak this evening. He wrote a letter to Jamie Spillane, town attorney on December 6, 2023 and there have been conversations since then. His clients asked him to read two paragraphs from the letter, which were as follows:

This repair is not a matter of convenience – it is a matter of necessity. If there were a small fire at my clients' residence, the additional time required for the arrival of fire prevention services, directly caused by the Town's failure to repair the Dewey Lane bridge, might cause the loss of the entire house. Illness or injury to any person at my clients' residence, which requires emergency medical treatment, may well be exacerbated as a consequence of the additional time for emergency medical services to arrive at my clients' residence again, as a consequence of the town's continued failure to repair the Dewey Lane bridge. Prior to my being retained, my clients served the town with written notice of the hazard created by this situation. I would think the town would wish to remove itself from this potential source of liability.

Mr. Stenger said this is an urgent issue for his client. Every step the town takes would be deeply appreciated by his client and him.

TOWN BOARD DISCUSSION

PITT

Councilwoman Pitt said transfer station stickers are on sale, and residents can come in and purchase them during the week, or on Saturday, January 20th, or purchase them by mail. Residents have until February 1st to utilize their sticker from last year. There will be an open position on the town planning board and the town board is accepting resumes for that position.

MCCARTHY

Councilman McCarthy said he and Wendel Weber, supervisor of buildings and grounds met with the supplier of the new meters for water district #2. There will be a letter going out by the end of this month to the residents, and they are hoping to be able to begin work in February and finish installing the new meters in two to three weeks. There has been discussion with Laberge to try to get grants to put EV charging stations here at town hall and at Lakeside Park. There was also discussion about purchasing electric vehicles for town use. There are also grants for the fire department and fire district and they will be working with Laberge on those potential grants. The town is also looking for some smaller grants moving forward for culverts.

SNOW

Councilwoman Snow said at the second meeting in February, there will be a presentation about the conservation advisory board. Mr. Chipkin will be making the presentation and she would be in contact with Wendel Weber's wife, who was also involved in the conservation advisory board when it existed. The board can ask questions and then she hoped the board could move this forward.

MYGAN

Councilman Mygan said he wanted to revisit from last week the meeting that is scheduled for October 2nd, which is Rosh Hashanah, the time was pushed back to 5 PM. Out of respect for our Jewish residents, he requested that meeting be postponed.

Councilman Mygan made a motion to cancel the October 2nd meeting, seconded by supervisor Schmitt, motion passed unanimously.

SCHMITT

Supervisor Schmitt said he wanted to let the public know there is a cotton tail rabbit study being done at Murrow Park by NYS DEC, so if representatives of NYS DEC are seen at the park, they are authorized to be there. This will not involve any trapping of rabbits, and no rabbits will be harmed during the study.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Harvey Matcovsky thanked councilman Mygan and the board for cancelling the October 2^{nd} meeting, which falls on Rosh Hashanah. He asked if there was a reason PJSC budget has been removed from the agenda.

Supervisor Schmitt said he and councilman McCarthy are still working with mayor Taylor and deputy mayor Locascio on the revision of the IMA.

Mr. Matcovsky said the PJSC tentative budget has an increase of over 10%, which includes \$43,000.00 in stipends mainly for elected officials. He hoped the decision would be made that seven commissioners are not needed and a stipend of \$5,500.00 to \$7,000.00 for the commissioners is uncalled for in lieu of the 10% increase in the budget. Mr. Matcovsky said it has been brought to the attention of the community that there is a problem in the building department where a lot of the records seem to be misplaced. He hoped an individual appointed to the building department would bring the record keeping up to date. Mr. Matcovsky asked how the board and bookkeeper concluded taking \$150,000.00 away from the highway superintendent for paving.

Supervisor Schmitt said that was the largest line in the budget the board had and the board is hoping to put a lot of that money back as the year goes on.

Joe Marotta, chairman of the Whaley Lake committee said the composition of the town board has changed and in the spirit of that change, legal action has been suspended between their community and the town board. Therefore, they are officially requesting a meeting between the town board and the committee to discuss the issues, solutions and obstacles that have prevented a viable solution to the Whaley Lake Dam spillway. At this time, he would like to know the willingness of each board member to attend and that the meeting should be scheduled in the next few weeks.

Councilwoman Pitt asked for documentation that the legal action has been suspended. Once that is received, the board can go from there.

Councilwoman Snow agreed.

Councilwoman Pitt asked if the Whaley Lake Dam Committee is an actual committee that was voted on through the township.

Mr. Marotta said after a year of horrible conditions on the lake, when the dam was put in at 704.8, there were weeds and algae, and many problems, and the community was in an uproar, and a meeting was held at the Holmes Civic Center. At that time, the supervisor Schmitt promised that they would get the full twelve inches and the residents wouldn't pay a dime. At that meeting, people were so angry, it was suggested bringing back the committee that originally created the district, which is now paying for the dam. Supervisor Schmitt thought it was a good idea and agreed with it at the time. The board should listen to the recording. The Whaley Lake Dam committee meets on a monthly basis and minutes are taken of those meetings. Many people contribute money, engineering and volunteer. The treasurer is William Huott.

Christine Mitchell said regarding the paving funding, a full time employee was added to the highway department, which was one of the reasons for the \$150,000.00 adjustment. She knows how much the board is committed to supporting the highway department. The problem is that there was a massive increase in health insurance that had to be absorbed. The town is not receiving revenue from Dutchess County that was anticipated. She is transparent with the transfers that are done, they are not done in a vacuum. She is committed to doing as much for the highway department as the board is.

Supervisor Schmitt made a motion at 6:40 PM to enter executive session to discuss the medical, financial, credit or employment history of a particular person or corporation, or matters leading to the appointment, employment, promotion, demotion, discipline, suspension or removal of a particular person or corporation, seconded by councilman McCarthy, motion passed unanimously.

The Board returned from executive session at 7:12 PM, no action was taken.
