They hoped the board would continue to support them.

Supervisor Schmitt read an update from Bob Brill, highway superintendent on all of the work the highway department has accomplished, and also stating total grants received in the amount of \$4,731,317.08. He thanked Mr. Brill for all of the work done by the highway department. Supervisor Schmitt reported on the amnesty program in the building department. They have closed 88 files, with over 100 permits closed. Once the permits are closed, they are given to the assessor's office so they can be placed on the tax rolls. They hoped to have the project completed in another month.
