Gayle Zelazny, town justice commented on the resolutions related to the health insurance, saying she reiterated her comments from the November 6th meeting, she understood that health insurance is expensive but felt that the option of MVP is being incentivized, and forced on employees. So, there is no choice, which is a hard choice when you're not sure if everything you need is covered. She felt the town board was taking individual lives into their own hands and making a decision that is not necessarily in the employees' best interest. She did not understand the push to do this right now, because the budget for 2025 budget has been passed with this item already included in the budget, and the money is there to fund NYSHIP. The increase is minimal and she felt the town could afford it. She suggested the board wait until next year to research this, when they could take the time to see what would be best for employees and what works for the town, and when the union contract will be negotiated. She also didn't understand why the MVP plan was getting an HRA card but no HRA card for the people who choose NYSHIP. She urged the board to wait and consider changes to the health insurance next year.
